### **Davis-Langemach PTA Council Award of Excellence**

#### **Background**

The "Davis-Langemach PTA Council Award of Excellence" is named after Mrs. True Davis, Sr., and Mrs. Vernon Langemach, both highly admired St. Joseph ladies, who are past State PTA Presidents.

#### **Determination of Winner**

The administrator, teacher, or staff member, who has been nominated, must have made a major difference in the life of a student of the St. Joseph School District. It should be something that will be of major impact in the child's life and must have taken place between the first day of school and the last day of school.

A nomination may be made by a parent/family member, administrator, teacher, staff person, or other adult community member. (No self nominations please.)

The administrator of the nominee as well as the nominating party must sign the form to assure validity.

Each month one winner will be selected and recognized by the St. Joseph PTA Council. The winner will be awarded a certificate of recognition. In addition, a book valued at \$25 will be given in honor of the winner to the school where they are employed. If they are not employed at a school, then they may select which school will receive the book.

An impartial panel of three individuals will determine the winners. The panel will include a school district official, a PTA Council representative, and a local parent.

Nominations submitted will be kept for consideration for that school year unless they are chosen as a winner.

The child's name will not be released to the public.

In order to be considered as the next month's award recipient, three copies of the nomination must be received by the 20<sup>th</sup> of the previous month. The first award will be in September.

# St. Joseph PTA Council Legislation Committee 2005-06 Program of Work



As the 2005-06 St. Joseph PTA Council Legislation Committee Chairperson, I plan to participate in the following activities for the year:

- 1. Attend St. Joseph PTA Council monthly meetings and present legislative information of importance to members.
- 2. Prepare articles for the **St. Joseph PTA Council Clippings**, as needed.
- 3. Attend political activities to hear and ask opinions of potential/current candidates and gain their opinions about education-related issues.
- 4. Register Buchanan County residents to vote, as a voter Registrar, as needed.
- 5. Email, fax, write, or call my state and federal Senators and Representatives or local officials as needed regarding issues concerning education or children.
- 6. Create a <u>St. Joseph PTA Council Legislative Network</u> for individuals who will quickly respond to emails from the St. Joseph PTA Council Legislation Chairperson when a local, state, or federal educational issue needs support via email, fax, letter, or phone call. (Please only communicate with federal officials via email, fax, or phone call. Mail is still detained due to national security issues.)
- 7. Provide a general lobbying guideline book for St. Joseph PTA Council members.
- 8. Support St. Joseph School District issues that affect education such as a levy, bond, or other issues.
- 9. Serve as a member of the Missouri PTA Legislative Network where I will respond to requests for action by Missouri PTA and encourage others to be a member of the Network.
- 10. Serve as a member of the National PTA Legislative Network where I will respond to requests for action by National PTA and encourage others to be a member of the Network.
- 11. Attend the St. Joseph Regional MSTA/Classroom Teachers' Association monthly Legislative Forums, held January through April at Hillyard Technical Center, serving as a greeter or moderator as needed representing St. Joseph PTA Council.
- 12. Invite legislators to visit and tour St. Joseph School District facilities.
- 13. Attend the Missouri PTA Legislative Rally or other rallies held in Jefferson City, Missouri, and advocate for PTA issues.
- 14. Visit the Missouri Legislative Capitol to visit with area Senators and Representatives.
- 15. Attend the annual Northwest Missouri/Kansas City MSTA Legislative Brunch held at an area Kansas City International Airport hotel.
- 16. Visit the offices of United States Senators Kit Bond and Jim Talent and US Congressman Sam Graves and other Missouri Congress members in Washington, DC, March 6-8, 2006, and speak to important educational issues.
- 17. Provide Legislative Committee guideline information sheets to be distributed at the St. Joseph PTA Council School of Information.
- 18. Thank state and federal Senators and Representatives with cards or letters of appreciation.
- 19. Assist with other activities as assigned by the St. Joseph PTA Council President.


