

- 4. Host a reception event for all students chosen for the state and/or national level.



You are being given the opportunity to **VOTE on Tuesday, November 6, 2007**, to continue the city's \$27 million Capital Improvements Program (CIP) for another five years. (**This is not a new tax**.) Revenues generated from the one-half cent CIP **sales tax** will create jobs and stimulate business investment throughout our growing community. The \$27 million will also be used to leverage an additional \$31 million in federal funding creating \$58 million in community investment.

St. Joseph is a growing community with a good quality of life. The projects in the 2008 CIP sales tax are about our quality of life and include projects that benefit our youth including a new Muchenberger Center, updated St. Joseph Parks playground equipment and flooring, as well as additional walking paths and many other projects beneficial to our community. Janet Fite, Bode Middle School instructor and great-granddaughter of (1887-1917) St. Joseph Parks Superintendent, Rudolph Rau, along with Sue Wagner, have put together an outstanding presentation of the beautiful conservatories and landscaping of Krug Park in its early years. Mr. Rau, a florist and a landscape architect, played a major role in the development of the Park's gardens. Janet will be sharing with us, through her families' collection of early Krug Park postcards, some of the history of Krug Park through the eyes of her Great-Grandfather Rau. Come and first hear the talk in the beautiful Krug Park Castle at 4:30 p.m., then enjoy "a walk in the Park" at 5:30 p.m. while raising money for Backpack Buddies. Second Harvest Food Bank will provide light refreshments/water for the walk.

Over 500 St. Joseph and Savannah children will be served by the **Backpack Buddies** program this year. These children are at risk of going hungry over the weekend. **Backpack Buddies** helps ensure these kids won't go hungry when school is not in session. Students who qualify for **Backpack Buddies** are given a backpack full of nutritious foods to eat over the weekend. On Monday, they return the backpack to be refilled for the following weekend.

Davis-Langemach-Kosek PTA Council Award of Excellence

Background

The "Davis-Langemach-Kosek PTA Council Award of Excellence" is named after Mrs. True Davis, Sr., and Mrs. Vernon Langemach, both highly admired St. Joseph ladies, who are past State PTA Presidents. This award is also in honor of Mrs. Sharon Kosek who is a past St. Joseph PTA Council President and Legislative chair.

Determination of Winner

The administrator, teacher, staff member, or volunteer who has been nominated, must have made a major difference in the life of a student of the St. Joseph School District. It should be something that will be of major impact in the child's life and must have taken place between the first day of school and the last day of school.

A nomination may be made by a parent/family member, administrator, teacher, staff person, or other adult community member. (No self nominations please.)

The administrator of the nominee as well as the nominating party must sign the form to assure validity.

Each month one winner will be selected and recognized by the St. Joseph PTA Council. The winner will be awarded a certificate of recognition. In addition, a book valued at \$25 will be given in honor of the winner to the school where they are employed. If they are not employed at a school, then they may select which school will receive the book.

An impartial panel of three individuals will determine the winners. The panel will include a school district official, a PTA Council representative, and a local parent.

Nominations submitted will be kept for consideration for that school year unless they are chosen as a winner.

The child's name will not be released to the public.

In order to be considered as the next month's award recipient, three copies of the nomination must be received by the 20th of the previous month. The first award will be in September.
