However, the MO PTA does have a template that you can use to print your membership cards. On their front page there is a link for membership and that will lead you to the template.

Backpack Buddies

"On Friday morning," says Roxanna Kerns, counselor at Hyde Elementary School, "I am always stopped by Cheyenne who says with the biggest smile on her face 'Today is the day we get Backpack Buddies, right Mrs. Kerns?' I respond with 'You're right kiddo.' As she walks away she will usually turn back and say 'Don't forget o.k.?"

Sadly, there are so many children like Cheyenne in the St. Joseph School District. Over the weekends, when free lunch and breakfast is not available, they are faced with the possibility of not having enough food to eat at home.

But there is hope. For 715 St. Joseph School District children, their backpacks are for more than just carrying books. That's because these children are carrying home something a little extra in their backpacks each weekend of the school year. Through Backpack Buddies, they receive enough food for breakfast, lunch and dinner for Saturday and Sunday.

For the 2009-2010 school year, the program grew by 65 children served. This growth is a direct result of the hard work of the Backpack Buddies Task Force, which is comprised of St. Joseph School District staff who are highly passionate about ensuring every child in our community have access to nutritious food.

Backpack Buddies is a program of Second Harvest of Greater St. Joseph. Sponsoring a Backpack Buddies child will provide the gift of food over each weekend of the school year for only \$125 (that's less than \$3.50 a weekend!).
