Registration for the bee is at 12:30 P.M. on Saturday, February 9, 2013, with the bee following immediately at 1:00 P.M. As always, the bee is held at Truman Middle School, 3227 Olive, St. Joseph, Missouri. # Balancing the Checkbook

Many Bonding Insurance Companies require someone who isn't listed on the checking account balance the account each month and sign that this was done. I have a form if you need but most bankstatements have this on the back page.

Here are the steps to reconciliating the checkbook.

- \*Take the ending balance shown on the bank statement.
- \*Add any outstanding Deposits or Credits not listed on statement.
- \*Subtract any outstanding Checks or Debits not listed on statement. This should match the balance in your checking account.

Make sure that you are completing a Treasurer's Report each month even if you don't meet you can still send them out. All of this helps to make sure everything balances. If you have made any errors it is so much easier to fix at the end of the month than trying to go back 2 months or more.

# All proposals will require the following information to be eligible for consideration:




